NORTHWEST NEIGHBORHOOD IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT



The City of Delray Beach, with funding from the Delray Beach Community Redevelopment Agency, is in the design stage of the Northwest Neighborhood Improvements Project.

The project runs from Lake Ida Road on the north, Swinton Avenue on the east, W. Atlantic Boulevard on the south, and Interstate 95 on the west.

The City held 10 public meetings in 2022 to present the Preliminary Design Report and get public input.

The resulting project will include roadway improvements with the goal of providing traffic calming to address speeding and traffic cut-through in the neighborhood and to allow for safer streets. Utility systems will be replaced or upgraded. Other improvements will be made to beautify and provide consistent design elements for the neighborhood area as a whole.

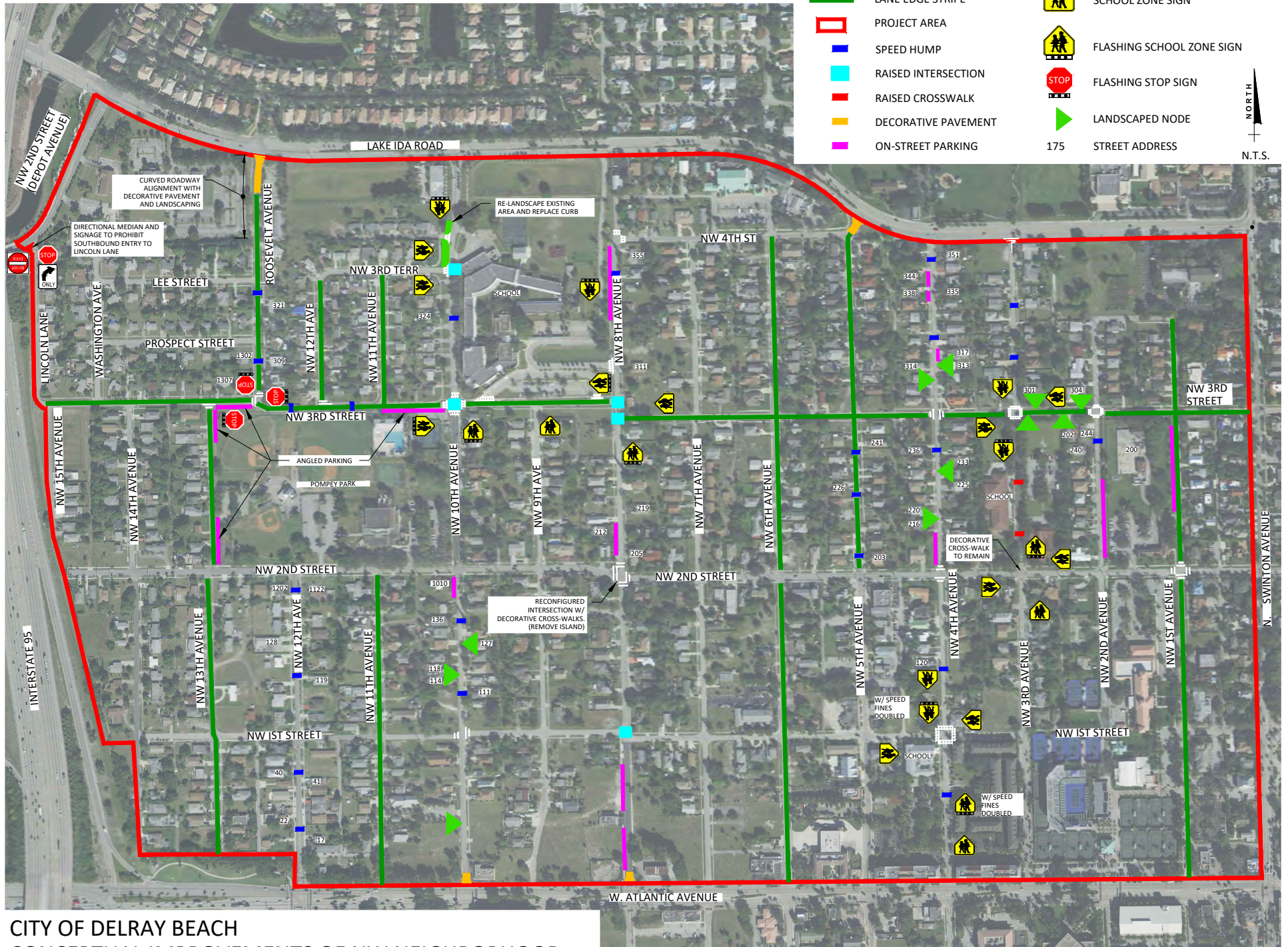
